Niki Nguyen, District 1 for Westminster's Redistricting Process - February 9, 2022

Dear Members of the City Council,

My name is Niki Nguyen. I am a resident of Westminster's 1st district and a member of the Westminster Redistricting Committee, a group of Westminster residents who have been regularly meeting for more than half a year researching and working towards advocating for an equitable redistricting for our communities.

Today, we are meeting to review and discuss potential maps for redistricting and I strongly urge you to move forward with map #404 for the 4 district map and map #503 for the 5 district map. These two both give proper representation to vital and significant communities within our city, specifically 1) mobile home park residents, 2) the Latinx population, 3) the low-income Vietnamese population, and 4) apartment residents. In the past iterations of our city maps, the district lines have fallen short of adequately taking into account the geographic locations of the aforementioned communities and we see this current redistricting process as a way to more fully support the critical communities of Westminster.

We propose the 4 district map #404 with these priorities in mind:

- District A maintains the integrity of a long-time single family homeowner community west of Goldenwest St and lives along the 405 Freeway together.
- District B creates a compact district that keeps low-income Latino and Vietnamese residents who primarily live in apartments, mobile homes, and single family homes together east of Goldenwest St up to Beach Blvd and north of Hazard Ave. This district contains the largest CVAP Latino population at 27.60% in and around Sigler Park. This district also keeps together the 2nd-tied largest mobile home park concentration: 3 total.
- District C creates a Federal Voting Rights Act-compliant district with the highest CVAP Vietnamese population of 69.39% of Vietnamese residents. This district includes numerous communities of interest, including low-income communities, working-class communities, mixed immigration status families, monolingual communities, tenant communities, and housing cost-burdened communities. This district contains the largest concentration of mobile home parks: 9 total. This district keeps the core of Bolsa Ave together.
- District D maintains the integrity of single-family homeowners, apartment, and mobile home residents together. This district contains the 2nd largest CVAP Vietnamese population at 62.1%. This district also keeps together the 2nd-tied largest mobile home park concentration: 3 total.

We propose the 5 district map #503 with these priorities in mind:

- District A maintains the integrity of an affluent long-time single family homeowner community west of Goldenwest St. together.

- District B creates a compact district that keeps low-income Latino and Vietnamese residents who primarily live in apartments, mobile homes, and single family homes together east of Goldenwest St. up to Beach Blvd. and north of Hazard Ave. This district contains the largest CVAP Latino population at 29.29% in and around Sigler Park.
- District C creates a Federal Voting Rights Act compliant district and a district that contains the 2nd largest mobile home park concentration: 4 total. This district contains a large number of low-income Vietnamese, White, and Latino populations.
- District D creates a Federal Voting Rights Act-compliant district with the highest CVAP Vietnamese population of 71.63% of Vietnamese residents. This district includes numerous communities of interest, including low-income communities, working-class communities, mixed immigration status families, monolingual communities, tenant communities, and housing cost-burdened communities. This district contains the largest concentration of mobile home parks: 8 total. This district keeps the core of Bolsa Ave. together.
- District E maintains the integrity of single-family homeowners, apartment, and mobile home residents together. This district contains the 2nd largest CVAP Vietnamese population at 63.33%. This district also keeps together the 3rd largest mobile home park concentration: 2 total.

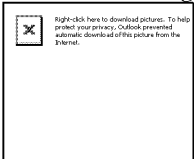
